### Subject:Modification of Sidewalk Subbase Standard for Upper Sykes Mountain<br/>Avenue and RT 5 Sidewalk Projects

- **Background:** On November 13, 2012, the Selectboard adopted the Town of Hartford Transportation Ordinance, along with the Department of Public Works Specifications. These Specifications were intentionally separate from the Transportation Ordinance to allow modifications in a more streamlined process than a formal ordinance would require. One basis for modifications is to remain in conformance with current state and federal requirements.
- **Discussion:** The Town is proceeding with the final design for the Upper Sykes Mountain Avenue and Route 5 sidewalk projects which are substantially funded through VTrans Transportation Grant Programs. The current Town of Hartford standard for sidewalk subbase is 24 inches. This is significantly greater than the State of Vermont standard of 6 inches. During project review with VTrans, the need for such a difference from the state standard has been raised.

In the attached memo from the Town's consulting engineer Stantec, the engineer suggested specifying "12 inches since it's difficult to achieve necessary compaction with only 6 inches of subbase. The 12 inches of subbase will result in a sidewalk that will have a base structurally sound to handle the loading anticipated." VTrans is supportive of this recommendation. Public Works Director Hannah Tyler also agrees with the modification of this standard for these two projects (see attached memo).

FinancialAccording to the Town's consulting engineer, the change to a 12 inch subbase willImpact:result in a marginal decrease in longevity and stability of the sidewalk.

**Recommendation:** Reduce the standard for the sidewalk subbase from 24 inches to 12 inches for the VTrans funded Upper Sykes Mountain Avenue and Route 5 sidewalk projects.

Hi Matt and Lori,

Attached is the VTrans standard detail for sidewalks. You'll note in the bottom left corner is the detail that calls for a minimum of 6" subbase. We specify 12" since it's difficult to achieve necessary compaction with only 6" of subbase. The 12" of subbase will result in a sidewalk that will have a base structurally sound to handle the loading anticipated.

24" of subbase can be used, but our opinion is that this will result in a marginal increase in longevity and stability, and this marginal benefit will not outweigh the cost associated with more excavation and more material required.

If the Town decides to use 12" subbase under the sidewalk, then <u>estimated</u> savings are approximately \$20,000 for the US-5 project and \$30,000 for the Sykes Mountain Avenue project. Please note these are preliminary estimates. We would need to update the plans and quantity takeoffs to get a more refined estimate of savings. To facilitate decision making, we will provide you with a proposal to make this change to the plans plus update plans to 2018 specifications and resubmit to VTrans for review and approval.

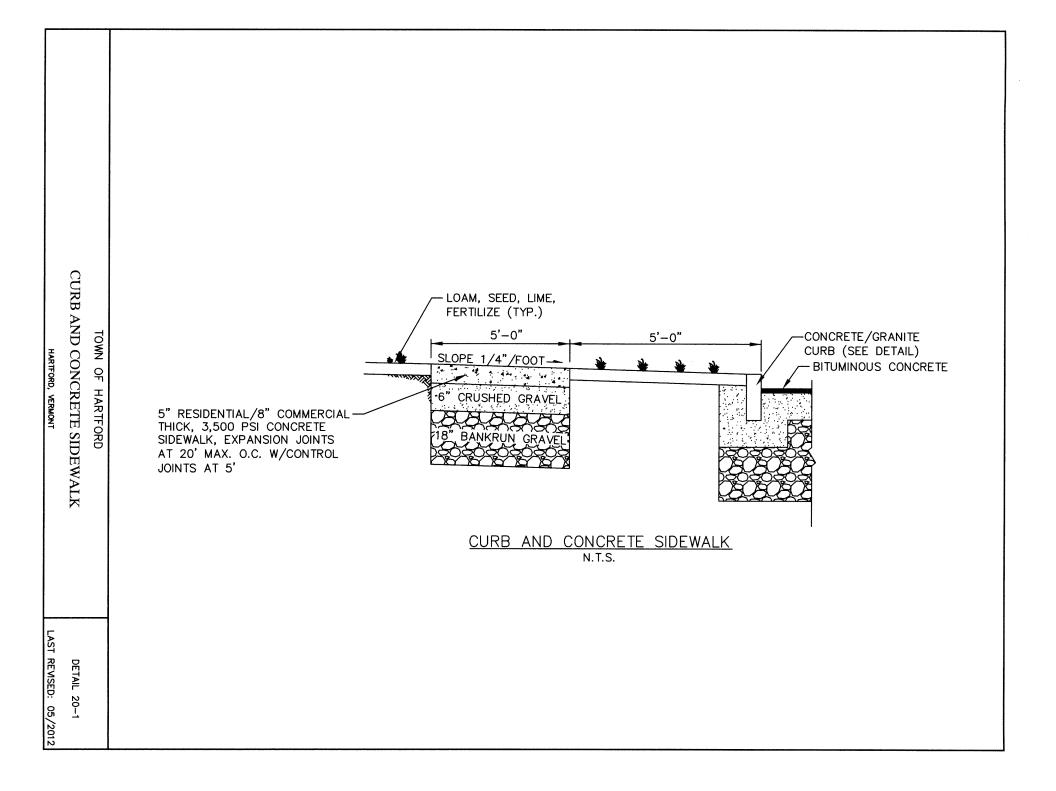

Subject:	Consideration to Join Multi-Jurisdiction Opioid Lawsuits	
Background:	Staff is aware of at least two multi-plaintiff lawsuits against pharmaceutical entities that, if the plaintiffs prevail, have potential settlement award shares for the Town of Hartford. On November 1, 2019, the Town received a letter from Attorney General T.J. Donovan advising towns to carefully consider the Multi-District Litigation ("MDL") group against Purdue Pharma and 12 other opioid manufacturers, distributers and pharmacies. This suit has a settlement formula that would distribute awards to all US counties.	
	Earlier this summer, staff was made aware of a different multi-jurisdiction suit against a larger list of defendants. The law firms of Cicala and Sanford-Heisler-Sharp represent the localities in this lawsuit ("Cicala and Sanford"). The Town of Bennington joined this suit as an individual party and will be a direct recipient of a share of the settlement award. Bennington joined on the condition that it will pay for legal representation only if damages are awarded and that it won't have any upfront costs in filing or pursuing action. The Town of Brattleboro is also considering joining the Cicala and Sanford suit.	
Discussion:	The Selectboard had a brief discussion of the options at its November 5 meeting under the Town Manager's Report, and placed it on the November 19 agenda for formal consideration.	
	According to the information referenced in the Attorney General's letter, the Town will be included in the MDL lawsuit by default unless it takes affirmative action to opt-out by November 22. In a <u>hypothetical</u> \$1 billion award, Windsor County, VT would receive settlement funds totaling \$181,816 based three evenly-weighted criteria: 1) the amount of opioids shipped to the County; 2) number of opioid deaths in the County; and 3) number of opioid use disorders in the County. Hartford would receive some portion of this.	
	Staff has been unable to determine the award formula of individually joining Bennington in the Cicala and Sanford lawsuit. The award is potentially larger than the MDL suit because of the number of defendants, but the cost to participate and determine the award share may involve more staff time and expense.	
	The Town of Hartford is not specifically precluded from joining more than one lawsuit, but it risks being dismissed from any one to ensure that it does not receive a "double- recoveries."	
Financial Impact:	Unknown.	
Recommendation:	Whether or not the Town enters into another lawsuit as an individual plaintiff, I do not recommend opting out of the MDL lawsuit. This is thee "safety net" approach that ensures that the Town will receive an award amount.

# As opioid litigation expands, Vermont towns weigh their options

An unprecedented legal mechanism has opened national litigation against prescription drug companies to nearly any city or town.

Last month, a packet of paperwork arrived at the town office in Kirby. The U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio needed to know: Did this Northeast Kingdom town of less than 500 people want to join a historic multi-district lawsuit against the companies accused of fueling the opioid crisis?

"We really didn't have much of a chance to look it over," Wanda Grant, Kirby's town clerk, said last week. The packet included a form: If town officials signed it, they would opt out of the suit. If they did nothing, the town would become part of a negotiating class that stands to include tens of thousands of municipalities around the country. The town's three-member selectboard would discuss the proposal at its next meeting.

Similar paperwork has landed at local governments around Vermont and the nation. Over the next two weeks, each of those municipalities will decide whether to join the **broad-ranging lawsuit** against several opioid

Vermont Attorney General TJ Donovan is now recommending that Vermont towns and cities join the suit. In a letter to local leaders, first reported by VPR <u>on Tuesday</u>, Donovan says joining the litigation may be the simplest path for municipalities to get reimbursed for their efforts fighting the crisis.

"I think it's important that the cities and towns that have been on the forefront of this crisis have a role to play if there's a potential recovery, and to get some money back to the Vermont cities and towns," Donovan said Wednesday.

The attorney general's office has separately brought lawsuits against OxyContin manufacturer Purdue Pharma, members of the billionaire Sackler family who own Purdue, and two major opioid distributors. Donovan had previously opposed opening the national suit to a broad list of municipalities, signing onto a letter stating that the maneuver could interfere with the state's settlement negotiations. But Donovan said that the court has now established a framework that resolves those concerns.

U.S. District Court Judge Dan Polster, who is based in Ohio, is overseeing the consolidated lawsuits of about 2,500 plaintiffs nationwide, broadly called the **National Prescription Opiates Litigation**.

Bennington and St. Albans are already named as plaintiffs in the national suit. Both towns previously retained private law firms to file separate, individual suits that brought them into the multi-district litigation, or MDL.

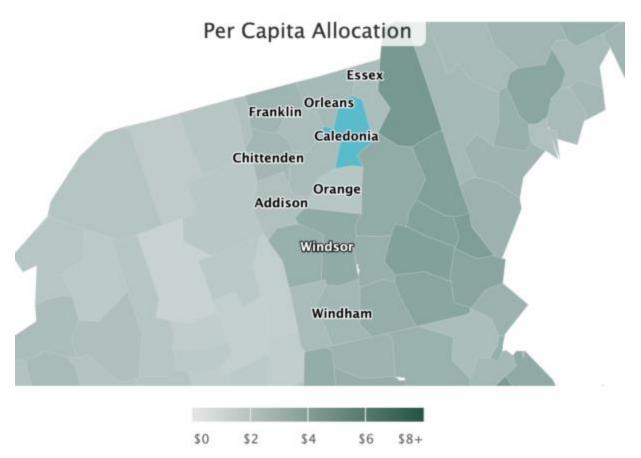
But Polster has ruled that a new class of plaintiffs are now eligible to join: Nearly every municipality in the country — about 34,000 local governments — will be automatically included in a potential settlement unless they opt out of the suit. Stanford Law professor Deborah Hensler <u>wrote in a blog post</u> that this is "a newfangled form of class action" — there is no precedent for a settlement class of this scope.

Donovan was one of 38 attorneys general who signed a July 23 letter **opposing the move**. The authors wrote that by giving local governments the power to negotiate a settlement that could affect parallel legal actions by states, the new structure would be an unconstitutional infringement of state sovereignty.

Donovan said Wednesday that this concern stemmed from the likelihood that all legal claims against the opioid companies — including his office's cases, which are separate from the MDL — would eventually become part of a "global settlement" paid by the opioid companies.

The letter's authors also said expanding the national suit would create procedural challenges that could delay a settlement. "Plaintiffs continue to propose an unprecedented process that, among other problems, would make 'global peace' more, not less, difficult to achieve," they wrote.

But on Sept. 11, <u>Polster ruled</u> that the opt-out system, called a "negotiation class," would proceed. Under the new structure, municipalities will be included in the suit unless they submit paperwork by Nov. 22 to opt out. The court has already determined, using data about the impacts of the opioid crisis, how a potential settlement <u>would be allocated</u> among the local governments included.



The allocation amount is based on a hypothetical \$1 billion gross settlement for counties and cities. For a more detailed look, click <u>here</u>.

A settlement proposal would be subject to a vote by a panel of representatives. If 75% of the representatives vote in favor of a settlement, the plaintiffs will be locked in to those terms. No representatives from Vermont municipalities are included on the panel.

The federal court has left Vermont cities and towns with a decision to make: sign on to pursue a broad settlement that's still short on details, or forgo a potential payout that could help offset the money they've spent fighting the crisis in their communities.

Stuart Hurd, the town manager of Bennington, said the town joined the national suit because it would give local leaders more leeway in deciding how to use potential settlement money.

Hurd said that while Donovan has indicated that he wants any awards from the state's cases to help local communities fight the opioid crisis, the Legislature would ultimately control how much to allocate to municipalities and how much to direct to the state's general fund. A settlement from an individual lawsuit, though, would go directly to the town.

"We get to determine how to use it," Hurd said. "We get to determine how it best suits the needs of our community."

Because Bennington pursued the suit before Polster's move to expand the negotiating class, the town retained a private law firm, Sanford Heisler Sharp, that is also representing municipalities in Virginia and Texas in the MDL. The firm will receive 25% of any settlement the town is awarded.

Hurd believes the town could be poised for a larger overall settlement because it is suing a broader range of companies, including pharmacy benefit managers, that are not defendants in the MDL.

Hurd spoke last month at a meeting, organized with the Vermont League of Cities and Towns, where representatives from Sanford Heisler Sharp encouraged more local leaders to file individual suits. But because the new settlement model is now available to every town, city and county in the state, private law firms may play less of a role going forward.

Rutland City Mayor David Allaire said Wednesday that Rutland was planning to join the national litigation, but that city officials didn't have the time or energy to work with outside attorneys. The city's Board of Aldermen voted Monday night to stay in the national settlement class and forgo filing a separate suit. "We're convinced, at least at this point right now, that this is the best way to go," Allaire said.

That's also the path Donovan is now recommending. "You can participate in the potential fruits of a settlement without having to file a lawsuit, hire attorneys, and most important incur additional attorneys' fees and costs," he wrote in the Nov. 1 letter.

But the dollar amount of a potential settlement is still unclear. In Kirby, selectboard members voted Monday night to opt out of the suit because they believed the payout would be insignificant. "We're a small town," said Town Clerk Wanda Grant this week. "We don't feel we would benefit much from it."

Donovan's guidance to Vermont towns comes as two of the state's lawsuits remain stalled in bankruptcy court. The state opted out of a proposed <u>settlement with Purdue Pharma</u> in September, saying the deal did not provide certainty of a payout. Because Purdue filed for bankruptcy as a result of that settlement, the remaining suits against the company and the Sacklers are now under the jurisdiction of a U.S. bankruptcy court in White Plains, NY.

According to the Washington Post, Judge Robert Drain on Wednesday <u>agreed to block litigation</u> in those cases until April. Donovan declined to discuss specifics on the bankruptcy court proceedings, saying only, "I think there's many more chapters to be written in this negotiation."

Dear Vermont Mayors, Town Managers and Selectboard Members:

I am writing to address recent questions arising from a notice inviting Vermont cities and towns to join a Negotiation Class involving opioid related litigation. We believe Vermont cities and towns should seriously consider joining the Negotiation Class because it provides a way to participate in recent efforts to settle on-going litigation against the manufacturers, distributors, and large pharmacies that created the opioid epidemic. The Negotiation Class provides the opportunity to participate without having to file a lawsuit, hire attorneys, and incur additional attorneys' fees. Vermont cities and towns will be automatically enrolled in the Negotiation Class they opt out by November 22, 2019. Answers to frequently asked questions related to the Negotiation Class can be found at https://www.opioidsnegotiationclass.info/Home/FAQ.

Many of you are dealing with the enormous fallout from the opioid epidemic. The harm to our communities has been staggering. The opioid crisis has caused a devastating loss of life in Vermont. Families have been torn apart, and many lives left in ruin. We have expended precious, limited resources to care for victims and the aftermath of addiction. This includes medical treatment, mental health care, family services, first responders such as police and rescue, and so many others.

It has been my number one priority as Attorney General to hold accountable those who have caused the opioid epidemic. We have sued opioid manufacturer Purdue Pharma, its owners the Sackler family, and the pharmaceutical distributors to bring those responsible for this epidemic to justice. I anticipate more lawsuits will follow. It is our intention that recoveries from these lawsuits will be utilized to address the opioid crisis across Vermont. And, I know many of Vermont's cities and towns would also like to take part in these efforts.

Many of you have been asked to take part in the Negotiation Class as part of the multidistrict litigation or "MDL" in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio. This MDL has gathered thousands of cases brought by other cities and towns across the country. The MDL essentially is the federal court's way of consolidating all these cases before a single court to efficiently address all these claims. The judge in the MDL authorized the creation of a Negotiation Class as a means for all cities and towns across the country to participate in the fruits of any settlement activity arising out of this court. You can participate without having to file your own case or hire your own attorneys.

To see the how monies might be divided across the country, and in your particular community, you can go to <u>www.OpioidsNegotiationClass.info</u>. You will automatically be included in this Negotiation Class unless you provide notice of your decision to "opt-out" by November 22, 2019.

It is my recommendation that Vermont cities and towns seriously consider participating in this Negotiation Class. As stated above, you can participate in the potential fruits of a settlement without having to file a lawsuit, hire attorneys, and most important incur additional attorneys' fees and costs.

I respect that each municipality will consider their individual needs and determine the best path for their community. Regardless how you may choose, the Vermont Attorney General's Office will continue to seek justice for the entire State of Vermont and hold those accountable who created and profited from the opioid crisis.

- 16. If there is a proposed settlement and my County or City is included in the Negotiation Class, but it disapproves of the settlement terms, can my County or City object to the settlement?

- 17. How long will the Negotiation Class last?
- 18. If there is a proposed Class settlement, how will the voting be done?
- 19. If there is a proposed Class settlement, how many votes are needed to approve it?
- 20. If there is a Class settlement, how will my County or City's share of the settlement be determined?
- 21. <u>What happens if a county and its constituent cities make different decisions about</u> <u>staying in the Class?</u>
- 22. If there is a settlement between a Defendant and a State or States, what impact will this Negotiation Class have on the division of monies between a State and the cities and counties within the State?
- 23. <u>Will Negotiation Class Representatives receive anything more than other Class</u> <u>Members?</u>
- 24. What is the Special Needs Fund?
- 25. Can my county or city exclude itself from the Negotiation Class?
- 26. How does my county or city exclude itself from the Negotiation Class?
- 27. If my county or city stays in the Negotiation Class, can it exclude itself later if it doesn't like a proposed settlement?
- 28. Who are the Class Counsel?
- 29. How do Class Counsel get paid?
- 30. <u>Under this proposal, what happens to my County or City's current fee agreement with</u> <u>outside counsel?</u>
- 31. How can my County or City keep up with what's going on in this case?
- 32. <u>Is there any connection between the Negotiating Class and the Purdue Chapter 11</u> <u>Bankruptcy Proceeding?</u>
  - 1. Why is a Negotiation Class being formed? What is its purpose?

The purpose of the Negotiation Class is to create a cohesive group of cities and counties to negotiate Classwide settlements, on a voluntary basis, with Defendants who make, distribute, or sell opioids nationwide. Class Representatives and Class Counsel will represent the Negotiation Class. Class Members will vote on any Class settlement proposal. If 75% of those Class Members who vote (as described in <u>FAQ 18 and 19</u>) support a proposed Settlement, Class Counsel will ask the Court to approve it. The ultimate purpose of the Negotiation Class is to make settlement easier to obtain.

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2 Is this the first Negotiation Class Action?

Yes. This is a new use of the Class action mechanism under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 23, reflecting the unique nature of the national opioids litigation. Unlike any mass litigation before, thousands of cities and counties nationwide are pursuing claims against major defendants. The goal is to recover money to help fight the opioids epidemic, provide prevention and treatment services going forward, and change Defendants' practices.

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#### 3. Why use a Class mechanism?

Joining all cities and counties together as a Negotiation Class gives them maximum negotiating power, makes the negotiation of comprehensive settlements a more practical process, enables Defendants to know the group with which they are negotiating, and enables Class Members to vote on resulting settlement offers.

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#### 4. Who are the Class Representatives?

The Court has authorized the following 49 counties and cities to serve as the Negotiation Class's Class Representatives: (1) County of Albany, New York; (2) City of Atlanta, Georgia; (3) Bergen County, New Jersey; (4) City of Baton Rouge/East Baton Rouge Parish, Louisiana; (5) Broward County, Florida; (6) Camden County, New Jersey; (7) Cass County, North Dakota; (8) City of Chicago, Illinois; (9) Cobb County, Georgia; (10) City of Concord, New Hampshire; (11) Cumberland County, Maine; (12) City of Delray Beach, Florida; (13) Denver, Colorado; (14) Escambia County, Florida; (15) Essex County, New Jersey; (16) County of Fannin, Georgia; (17) Franklin County, Ohio; (18) Galveston County, Texas; (19) County of Gooding, Idaho; (20) City of Grand Forks, North Dakota; (21) County of Hennepin, Minnesota; (22) City of Indianapolis, Indiana; (23) County of Jefferson, Alabama; (24) Jefferson County/City of Louisville, Kentucky; (25) Jersey City, New Jersey; (26) Kanawha County, West Virginia; (27) King County, Washington; (28) City of Lakewood, Ohio; (29) City of Los Angeles, California; (30) City of Lowell, Massachusetts; (31) City of Manchester, New Hampshire; (32) Maricopa County, Arizona; (33) Mecklenburg County, North Carolina; (34) The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County, Tennessee; (35) Milwaukee County, Wisconsin; (36) Monterey County, California; (37) City of Norwalk, Connecticut; (38) County of Palm Beach, Florida; (39) Paterson City, New Jersey; (40) City of Phoenix, Arizona; (41) Prince George's County, Maryland; (42) Riverside County, California; (43) City of Saint Paul, Minnesota; (44) City of Roanoke, Virginia; (45) County of Rockland, New York; (46) City and County of San Francisco, California; (47) County of Smith, Texas; (48) County of Tulsa, Oklahoma; and (49) Wayne County, Michigan.

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#### 5. Who are the Defendants?

The Court has authorized the Negotiation Class to negotiate with 13 Defendants (including their affiliates): (1) Purdue, (2) Cephalon, (3) Endo, (4) Mallinckrodt, (5) Actavis, (6) Janssen, (7) McKesson, (8) Cardinal, (9) AmerisourceBergen, (10) CVS Rx Services, Inc., (11) Rite-Aid Corporation, (12) Walgreens, and (13) Wal-Mart. The Negotiation Class is authorized to negotiate settlements with any of these 13 Defendants, on any of the claims or issues identified below in FAQ 7, or other claims or issues arising out of the same factual predicate. If Class Counsel seek to negotiate for the Class with any other defendants, they can file a motion asking the Court to amend the Class certification order.

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#### 6. Has a Class settlement been reached with Defendants yet?

No. No Class settlement has been reached yet with any Defendant. But the existence of a Negotiation Class makes the possibility of Class settlement more feasible because a Defendant will know the group with which it is negotiating. There is no guarantee, however, that there will be a Class settlement and it is possible that there will be settlements that do not encompass the Class, such as settlements between one or more Class Members and one or more Defendants.

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#### 7. What claims and issues are certified for the Negotiation Class?

In this Negotiation Class, the Court certified two federal Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act ("RICO") claims and two federal Controlled Substances Act ("CSA") issues. The RICO claims and the issues related to the CSA are similar across the country and the Class. The first RICO claim alleges that five Defendants misled physicians and the public about the need for and addictiveness of prescription opioids, all in an effort to increase sales. The second RICO claim alleges that eight Defendants ignored their responsibilities to report and halt suspicious opioid sales, all in an effort to artificially sustain and increase federally-set limits (quotas) on opioid sales. The CSA issues allege that the CSA required Defendants to create systems to identify, suspend, and report unlawful opioid sales, and that Defendants failed to meet those obligations. As noted in FAQ 5, above, the Negotiation Class is authorized to negotiate Class settlements concerning these claims and issues or other claims or issues arising out of the same factual predicate. However, this Negotiation Class does not involve claims by State governments against the Defendants and no Class settlement will release or otherwise interfere with any State government's current or future litigation. This Negotiation Class concerns claims only of counties and cities. You can read more about these claims and issues in the Court's Memorandum Opinion certifying this Class, which is posted here (/Content/Documents/Opinion Certifying Negotiation Class.pdf).

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8. Has the Court decided any claims or issues?

No. The Court has not decided any Classwide claims or defenses on the merits and the Court will not render any Classwide decisions on the merits of any claims asserted by the Class or individual Members of it. By establishing this Negotiation Class and issuing the notice, the Court is not suggesting the Class would win or lose this case. This Class has been certified for negotiation purposes only.

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#### 9. What entities are included in the Negotiation Class?

The Negotiation Class is defined as:

All counties, parishes, and boroughs (collectively, "counties"); and all incorporated places, including without limitation cities, towns, townships, villages, and municipalities (collectively "cities").

A complete current list of Class Members is available <u>here (/Content/Documents/Cities</u> <u>and Counties.xlsx)</u>. The list may be updated as the Court may order.

The terms "counties" and "cities" are used only as shorthand. The Class includes political subdivisions with other names, such as parishes, villages, towns, townships, etc. The list of Class Members was devised primarily from the U.S. Census Bureau lists of governmental entities that provide services to their residents. Check the Cities and Counties lists posted <u>here (/Content/Documents/Cities and Counties.xlsx)</u> to confirm whether you are a Negotiation Class Member.

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10. Are counties and cities with state court-filed actions considered part of the Negotiation Class?

Yes. Counties and cities that sue in state court are Members of this Negotiation Class, with the option to opt out. However, nothing about Membership in the Negotiation Class interferes with the rights of any federal or state court plaintiffs to proceed with their own cases for litigation, trial, or individual settlement. Only if and when a Class settlement has been reached, has been approved by 75% of the voting Class Members as described in FAQ 19, and has been approved by the Court, would Class Members lose their ability to proceed on their own, in exchange for the settlement benefits that they would receive.

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11. How does the Negotiation Class affect an opioid lawsuit that my County or City has filed or may file?

The Court's certification of the Negotiation Class does not automatically end or immediately affect any opioid suit that a Class Member has filed, whether in federal or state court. Therefore, your county or city does NOT need to opt out of the Class in order to prosecute, try, or settle its own case against one or more Defendants. By remaining in the Class, however, your county or city does risk dismissal of its own lawsuit (or loss of the right to file one if it hasn't already done so) against a settling Defendant if a Class settlement is reached and approved prior to your county or city obtaining any relief (at trial or through a non-class settlement) on its own (although you would obtain money from the Class settlement).

Specifically, under the Court's Order certifying the Negotiation Class (see paragraph 13 of the <u>Order (/Content/Documents/Order Certifying Class and Approving Notice.pdf)</u>), even if you remain a member of the Negotiation Class, you do NOT give up your right to file or prosecute your individual suit, including taking the case all the way through trial and verdict, or negotiating your own settlement against one or more Defendants. The filing of complaints and motions, pursuit of pretrial discovery, pretrial hearings, trials, and individual settlements prior to the approval of any Class settlement are NOT affected by membership in the Negotiation Class. Again, this applies to cases in both federal and state court.

Importantly, even if your county or city obtains a judgment against one or more of the 13 Defendants or it reaches a settlement with one or more of them, it will *still* remain a Class Member with respect to all of the other Defendants. Therefore, if your county or city accepts and collects on a judgment or a settlement with a particular Defendant before there is a final, approved Class settlement with that Defendant, your county or city will not automatically be entitled to receive *additional* compensation with respect to that Defendant through the Class settlement (but it will be bound by any Class settlement to the extent the Class settlement settles claims against other Defendants). Similarly, if a county or city has a case against a particular Defendant that goes to trial and a verdict is returned in favor of that Defendant, your county or city won't automatically be entitled to share in any Class-approved and Court-approved settlement that the Class may later reach with that same Defendant (but it will be bound by any Class settlement to the extent the Class settlement settles claims against other Defendants).

The underlying presumption is that Class members should not be able to obtain doublerecoveries under their own settlements/judgments and under a Class settlement. Thus, while it is possible that a Class settlement could be reached that will allow Class members who have obtained individual settlements or gone to verdict at trial to participate in a Class settlement to some extent (such as by giving up rights under individual settlements or judgments), it also is possible that, once a Class member has obtained an individual settlement with, or gone to verdict in a trial against, one or more Defendants, those Defendants will not agree to allow the Class member to participate in the Class settlement fully or at all.

Because there are many ways that individual settlements/verdicts might interact or overlap with a Class settlement, the Court has reserved authority to determine in the context of actual situations whether Class members with prior judgments or settlements should be precluded from participation in any particular Class settlement. The Court will presume that, once a county or city has collected on an individual settlement or judgment with respect to a Defendant, that county or city cannot also participate in any Class settlement fund with respect to the same Defendant. However, the Court will allow a county or city to make an application (with notice to the Class Representatives, Class Counsel, and relevant Defendant(s)) to overcome the presumption by demonstrating good cause in particular circumstances.

**Example 1**: County A has a case against Defendant X, an opioids manufacturer, that goes to trial and it obtains a judgment against Defendant X. County A will be allowed to collect on its judgment against Defendant X, but *not* to also share in any settlement that the Class negotiates with Defendant X (unless County A gives up its judgment). County A, however, will still remain a Class Member and *will* be entitled to share in a settlement that the Class later reaches with Defendant Y, an opioids distributor, or Defendants other than Defendant X.

**Example 2**: County B has a case Defendant Y, an opioids distributor, that goes to trial and a verdict is returned in favor of Defendant Y. County B will *not* be allowed to share in any settlement that the Class negotiates with Defendant Y. County B, however, will still remain a Class Member and *will* be entitled to share in settlements that the Class later reaches with Defendant Z, a pharmacy, or Defendants other than Defendant Y.

**Example 3**: County C has a case against Defendant X, an opioids manufacturer, that it settles. The Class later reaches a settlement with Defendant X, as well as with Defendant Y, an opioids distributor, and with Defendant Z, a pharmacy. Unless Defendant X agrees to void the settlement with County C, County C will *not* be allowed to share in the settlement that the Class reaches with Defendant X, but it *will* be allowed to keep what it received under its individual settlement, and it will be allowed to share in the settlement that the Class negotiates with Defendants Y and Z.

a. If my county or city participates in the Negotiation Class, does it waive any rights to contest federal jurisdiction over any lawsuit the county or city has filed or may file concerning the Opioid epidemic?

On October 4, 2019, Judge Polster issued an order specifically confirming that a county or city can participate in the Negotiation Class without giving up any right to contest federal court jurisdiction over that county or city's claims concerning the Opioid epidemic. For example, if your county or city filed a lawsuit in state court and that lawsuit was removed to federal court, your county or city may participate in the Negotiation Class and still argue that its lawsuit should be remanded to state court. As a separate issue, however, if your county or city participates in the Negotiation Class, it will be subject to the jurisdiction of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio (Judge Polster) with respect to matters pertinent to the Negotiation Class itself.

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12. How does the Negotiation Class affect other types of opioid plaintiffs that are not counties or cities?

The Negotiation Class does not directly affect the litigation or settlement of the claims of other types of plaintiffs, such as Indian Tribes, third party payors, and others, that are proceeding in federal or state courts. These plaintiffs can organize themselves as groups or propose their own Classes, for trial or settlement purposes.

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- **13.** Now that the Court has approved this process, what will happen next? The creation of the Negotiation Class has these next steps:
  - On September 11, 2019, Judge Polster, the federal judge overseeing all of the national opioids litigation, certified the Negotiation Class to go forward.
  - On or before September 20, 2019, Class Action Notice will be sent via First-Class mail and posted to this website to all Class Members.
  - Class Members have until November 22, 2019 to decide whether to participate or to opt out of the Class. This is the "opt-out period." All Class Members are automatically included in the Class. If a Class Member wants to participate, it does not need to do anything at this point. Only Class Members that wish to exclude themselves ("opt out") and not participate in the Class must act: they must submit a copy of the Exclusion Request Form available <u>here</u> <u>(/Content/Documents/Exclusion Request Form.pdf)</u> on or before November 22, 2019, using the instructions in FAQ 26.
  - After the close of the opt-out period, the Court will enter an order confirming the Membership of the Class, saying who is in and who is out of the Class.
  - After that, the Class will operate if, and only if, one or more of the Defendants wishes to negotiate with the Class as a whole through the Negotiation Class mechanism.
  - If a proposed Class settlement is reached, the proposal will be submitted to the entire Class Membership for its approval or rejection in accordance with the voting formula (described in <u>FAQ 18 and 19</u>). If no proposed settlement is reached, the Class will not vote and will have no other role.

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14. If my County or City chooses to participate in the Negotiation Class, how will it know when there is a proposed Class settlement?

All Negotiation Class Members will be given advance notice of any Class settlement offer, including details on its terms and conditions, and they will have an opportunity to vote on each settlement offer. Class Members will be able to cast their vote securely, through this website, which will establish a voting identity and portal for each Class Member. Only Class settlements achieving 75% approval votes, by number, by allocation, and by

population, of the litigating and non-litigating Class Members that vote (as described in <u>FAQ 19</u>) will be submitted to the Court, which will make the final determination of whether to approve the settlement.

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15. If there is a proposed Class settlement, does the Court still have to approve it? Yes. If there is a proposed settlement that is approved by 75% of the voting Class Members, as described in <u>FAQ\_18</u> and 19, the Court will review and decide whether to approve it, under the Class action settlement approval process set forth in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 23(e). Generally, the Court will assess whether any settlement is fair, reasonable, and adequate. All applications for fees and costs also require court approval under Rule 23 procedures. (See <u>https://www.law.cornell.edu/rules/frcp/rule\_23</u> (<u>https://www.law.cornell.edu/rules/frcp/rule\_23</u>).)

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16. If there is a proposed settlement and my County or City is included in the Negotiation Class, but it disapproves of the settlement terms, can my County or City object to the settlement?

Yes. As a Negotiation Class Member, you will be entitled under Rule 23(e) to object to any settlement, even if it has received approval from the Class. However, as described in <u>FAQ</u> <u>27</u>, you will likely not be able to exclude yourself from the Class at that time. An objection explains your concerns to the Court for its consideration but does not remove you from the Class.

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17. How long will the Negotiation Class last?

The Negotiation Class will last for 5 years from the date it is certified by the Court. The Court certified the Class on September 11, 2019 and the Negotiation Class will last until September 11, 2024. After that date, the Class will not exist as an entity with which a Defendant can negotiate. However, the Negotiation Class will continue to exist with regard to: (1) any Class settlements presented to the Negotiation Class for a vote before that date, to carry out the voting and approval process; and (2) any Class settlements reached before that date, to complete settlement administration and enforcement.

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#### 18. If there is a proposed Class settlement, how will the voting be done?

Each Class Member will vote only once on any particular Class settlement proposal. The vote will simply be yes-or-no, in favor of or against the proposed settlement. Class Members that do not vote will not be counted as either yes or no votes; as with an election for government office in the United States, the only votes that are counted are those of the voters who actually cast votes. Class Members' votes will be tabulated mechanically within each applicable voting pool, to make sure that 75% of each pool is in favor of the

proposed settlement before it is presented to the Court. The voting pools are described in <u>FAQ 19</u>. Voting tabulation does not require any effort by the Class Members. The requirement of 75% support of voting Class Members across the different voting pools ensures that no settlement will go forward without a wide cross-section of support from cities and counties of all sizes and interests.

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- 19. If there is a proposed Class settlement, how many votes are needed to approve it? The agreement to be bound by a supermajority vote means that no settlement can be reached that would bind the Negotiation Class without the approval of 75% of the voting Class Members, defined in several ways. To be binding, 75% of those voting in each of the following six categories must approve a proposed settlement:
  - 75% of the total number of voting Class Members that had filed suit as of June 14, 2019 ("litigating entities"). This number is based on all individual Class Members who had suits on file regardless of size, so that each voting entity has one vote;
  - 75% of the total number of voting Class Members that had not filed suit as of June 14, 2019 ("non-litigating entities"). This number is based on all individual Class Members who had not filed suit, regardless of size, so that each voting entity has one vote;
  - 75% of the total population of all voting Class Members that had filed suit as of June 14, 2019. For this computation, the vote of the county or city is weighted according to its population, with each person in a voting city and each person in a voting county equal to one vote. Thus, by way of example, if a county votes yes and has a population of 20,000, and a city within the county votes yes and has a population of 10,000, the county's vote is weighted as 20,000 votes in favor, and the city's vote is recorded as 10,000 votes in favor. The population for each County or City will be based on current census data. The current data is presented <u>here</u> <u>(/Content/Documents/Cities and Counties.xlsx)</u>. Individual residents in this category may be counted twice, once as a resident of a municipality, and once as a resident of a county;
  - 75% of the total population of all voting Class Members that had not filed suit as of June 14, 2019. For this computation, the vote of the county or city is weighted according to its population, with each person in a voting city and each person in a voting county equal to one vote. Thus, by way of example, if a county votes and has a population of 20,000, and a city within the county votes yes and has a population of 10,000, the county's vote is weighted as 20,000 votes in favor, and the city's vote is recorded as 10,000 votes in favor. Again, the population for each County or City will be based on current census data. The current data is presented here (/Content/Documents/Cities and Counties.xlsx). Individual residents in this category may be counted twice, once as a resident of a municipality, and once as a resident of a county;

- 75% of the litigating Class Members casting votes, weighted by their settlement fund allocations as shown at the Allocation Map posted <u>here</u> (<u>https://allocationmap.iclaimsonline.com</u>); and
- 75% of the non-litigating Class Members casting votes, weighted by their settlement fund allocations as shown at the Allocation Map posted <u>here</u> <u>(https://allocationmap.iclaimsonline.com)</u>.

For purposes of counting votes, only votes cast will be considered. In order for a proposed settlement to be binding on the Negotiation Class, 75% of those Class Members who cast votes in each of these six categories must be in favor. No settlement will be submitted to the Court for final approval unless 75% of those voting in each of the six categories are in favor. No county or city that is not a Class Member as of the deadline for a vote on a proposal will be allowed to vote on that proposal.

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## 20. If there is a Class settlement, how will my County or City's share of the settlement be determined?

Any Class settlement funds will be distributed in three steps:

Step 1: Each county's share of the settlement will be distributed in accordance with an "allocation model." The allocation model uses three factors, based on reliable, detailed, and objective national data, to determine the share of a settlement fund that each county will receive. These factors address the most critical causes and effects of the opioid crisis and are weighted equally (1/3-1/3): (1) the amount of opioids shipped to the county adjusted as described below; (2) the number of opioid deaths that occurred in that county; and (3) the number of people who suffer opioid use disorder in that county. The amount of opioids shipped to a county is adjusted based on opioid use disorder prevalence or the rate of opioid-involved deaths in the county, whichever is worse relative to national averages. The model makes this adjustment because the oversupply of opioids had more deleterious effects in some counties than in others. Thus, the allocation model is designed not to favor either small or large counties based solely on population. Ultimately, the model allocates settlement funds in proportion to where the opioid crisis has caused actual harm.

Step 2: Counties and their constituent cities, towns, and boroughs may distribute the funds allocated to the county among all of the jurisdictions in any manner they choose. If the county and cities cannot agree on how to allocate the funds, the <u>Allocation Map</u> (<u>https://allocationmap.iclaimsonline.com</u>) reflects a default allocation that will apply. The default allocation formula uses historical federal data showing how the specific county and the cities within it have made opioids-related expenditures in the past. Any of the affected jurisdictions may ask a Special Master to apply a different formula.

Step 3: If the default allocation is used and a city's share is less than \$500, then that amount will instead be distributed to the county in which the city lies to allow practical application of the abatement remedy. Affected cities could seek recovery through intra-

county allocation described in Step 2, or from the Class Members' Special Needs Fund (see <u>FAQ 24</u>). In the rare circumstance that a city with a share of less than \$500 lies in a county that does not have a county government, the amount would instead go to the Class Members' Special Needs Fund, and Class members could seek recovery from that Fund.

Further information about the allocation formulas and their data sources are available <u>here (/Home/Documents)</u>.

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- 21. What happens if a county and its constituent cities make different decisions about staying in the Class?
  - If a county and all of its constituent cities remain in the Class, each entity's share will be determined as explained in <u>FAQ 20</u>.
  - If a county remains in the Class, but one or more cities within the County are not in the Class, there are a variety of ways that a Class settlement might address that situation, but it is possible that a Class settlement would require that the County's allocation be reduced.
  - If a county is not in the Class, but cities within that county remain in the Class, there are a variety of ways a Class settlement might address that situation. One possibility is that a city would receive no direct monetary allocation because its county has opted out, but that it could seek monetary relief through the Special Needs Fund (see <u>FAQ 24</u>). If a settlement provides a city no possibility of monetary relief because its county has opted out, Class Counsel anticipates the city would not be required to release its claims against the settling Defendant.

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22. If there is a settlement between a Defendant and a State or States, what impact will this Negotiation Class have on the division of monies between a State and the cities and counties within the State?

The Negotiation Class process does not interfere with a Defendant's ability to settle directly with one or more States. If a Defendant reaches a settlement directly with a State, nothing about this Negotiation Class process would affect the distribution of those settlement funds between the State and its own cities or counties. The Court has explicitly ordered that the Class's lawyers not involve themselves or the Class in the process of allocating monies secured by States between themselves and their counties and cities.

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23. Will Negotiation Class Representatives receive anything more than other Class Members? Negotiation Class Representatives do not receive preferential treatment under any settlement simply for serving as Class Representatives. Their allocation will be calculated in precisely the same manner as every other Class Member's. However, they can apply to the Court for reimbursement of costs and expenses incurred by reason of serving as Class Representatives. Also, courts often award a modest amount to Class Representatives, called an incentive or service award, so as to encourage Class Representatives to step forward on behalf of others. Any such awards are subject to Class notice and Court approval.

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#### 24. What is the Special Needs Fund?

Fifteen percent (15%) of any Class settlement fund will be put into the "Special Needs Fund." Any Class Member may apply for a distribution from the Special Needs Fund: (1) to recover its costs of litigating its own opioids lawsuit, if that case was filed before June 14, 2019; and/or (2) to obtain additional relief for any local impact of the opioids crisis that is not captured by the Class Member's allocation. Applications will be made to and approved by a court-appointed Special Master, on a case-by-case basis. Any unawarded amount remaining in this Special Needs Fund would revert to the Class.

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#### 25. Can my county or city exclude itself from the Negotiation Class?

Yes. You have a one-time opportunity to exclude your county or city from the Class and you must do so before November 22, 2019. You must follow the procedure set forth in <u>FAQ 26</u> below to exclude your county or city. As explained in <u>FAQ 27</u>, you will likely not be given a second opportunity to exclude your county or city from the Class if a settlement is later reached and you should not count on such an opportunity being available at that time.

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- 26. How does my county or city exclude itself from the Negotiation Class? You may exclude your county or city ("opt out") by signing and sending, either by email or by first-class U.S. mail, the <u>Exclusion Request Form (/Content/Documents/Exclusion</u> <u>Request Form.pdf)</u>.
  - If submitted by email, the form must be sent to <u>info@OpioidsNegotiationClass.info</u> (<u>mailto:info@OpioidsNegotiationClass.info</u>) on or before **November 22, 2019**.
  - If submitted by mail, the form must be *postmarked* on or before **November 22**, **2019** and sent by first-class U.S. mail to:

NPO Litigation P.O. Box 6727 Portland, OR 97228-6727

The Exclusion Request Form must be signed by an authorized official or employee of the county or city itself, under penalty of perjury pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, and is subject to verification by the Court. If you exclude your county or city from the Negotiation Class,

your county or city will not be bound by any Orders or Judgments regarding the Class, and it will have no right to share in any settlement reached by the Class.

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### 27. If my county or city stays in the Negotiation Class, can it exclude itself later if it doesn't like a proposed settlement?

Not under the current Court Order. The Court's Order certifying the Negotiation Class provides only one opportunity for a county or city to exclude itself from the Class. The exclusion deadline ends on **November 22, 2019**. If a settlement is reached and proposed to the Class for its approval, Class Members who do not support the settlement may (1) vote against it and/or, (2) if the settlement is nonetheless approved by the Class votes, file objections with the Court. Rule 23 permits a court to offer a second opportunity for Class Members to opt out when a settlement is proposed, but the Rule does not require the Court to give Class Members a second opportunity to opt out. In this case, it is anticipated that the Court will not give Class Members a second opportunity to opt out. Therefore, Class Members should not rely on that possibility. Class Members should expect that there will be no opportunity to opt out of the Class after November 22, 2019.

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#### 28. Who are the Class Counsel?

The Court has authorized the following six lawyers to jointly represent the Negotiation Class: Jayne Conroy and Christopher A. Seeger are Co-Lead Negotiation Class Counsel and Gerard Stranch, Louise Renne, Mark Flessner, and Zachary Carter are Negotiation Class Counsel. Each of these six lawyers represents only cities or counties in Opioidsrelated litigation.

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#### 29. How do Class Counsel get paid?

Class Counsel will apply to the Court for approval of fees and costs under Rule 23(h). As a Class Member, you will receive notice and have an opportunity to object to any such application. The Court may appoint fee committees to make recommendations of any fee awards, to avoid duplication of payment, and to ensure appropriate compensation of those whose efforts provided a common benefit. The Court will make the final decision about all fees paid out of the Class's recovery to any lawyer.

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### 30. Under this proposal, what happens to my County or City's current fee agreement with outside counsel?

The current fee agreement that a county or city has with its outside counsel remains in effect. Membership in the Negotiation Class does not change that. In the event of any settlement that achieves Class and Court approval, there would be a "Private Attorneys Fund" from which outside counsel for Class Members that had signed retainer

agreements for opioid epidemic-related litigation before June 14, 2019 could apply for fees and costs in lieu of any current fee agreement. That would be a voluntary decision between the county or city and its outside counsel. A total of up to 10% (maximum) of any approved Class settlement amount will be held in the Private Attorneys Fund. Any unawarded amount remaining in this Fund would revert to the Class. The Court must approve all payments from this Fund.

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**31.** How can my County or City keep up with what's going on in this case? Pertinent news and information will be posted at this website, on an ongoing basis. As a Class Member, you can also sign up <u>here (/Request)</u> for email notices alerting you to the fact that new information has been posted to this website.

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32. Is there any connection between the Negotiating Class and the Purdue Chapter 11 Bankruptcy Proceeding?

One defendant, Purdue, has declared bankruptcy. To seek relief against Purdue, your jurisdiction must file its own proof of claim with the bankruptcy court by the bar date (bar date information will be posted on this website when it becomes available). You do NOT have to opt out of the Negotiation Class to file a proof of claim in the bankruptcy court.

In other words, whether you remain in or opt out of the Negotiation Class will have no effect on your rights or obligations as a Creditor in the Purdue Bankruptcy, including any right to receive a distribution or recovery in the bankruptcy. The Negotiation Class (and any decision about whether to remain in or opt out) is not at this point connected in any way to the Purdue Chapter 11 Cases.

Negotiation Class Counsel may file and request Bankruptcy Court approval of a class proof of claim, if appropriate to facilitate recovery to the Class in connection with any settlement or plan reached in the Purdue Bankruptcy. You should not assume that any such claim, if filed, will be accepted or approved. Even if such a claim is approved, it will not change the overarching fact that the treatment of every town, city, county, municipality or similar political subdivision in Purdue's bankruptcy will not be affected by whether such political subdivision remains in or opts out of the Negotiation Class.

#### 1. Public, Selectboard Comments and Announcements: TBD

<u>Citizen Comments</u>: Mike Morris had suggestions for alternative parking sites in downtown WRJ. He spoke to Bill Matthewson who owns 6 acres of land behind Norwich Technologies building on Bridge Street. The owner is interested. Also Mr. Morris spoke about the Court parking lots.
